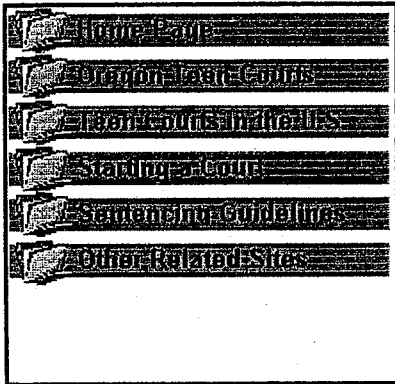

As crime skyrockets in many communities, citizens and authorities alike are finally beginning to look for long-lasting, effective answers to stem the tide of juvenile crime. Reaching the youth who have committed a crime before they become hardened criminals is an essential step in reversing the crime trend.

A Sentencing Court

Teen court, also known as peer court, is a sentencing court for youths who have committed an offense. Teen courts primarily deal with first-time offenders. After arrest, the young offender must plead guilty to the charge in juvenile court. With the juvenile court's permission, the offender agrees to be sentenced and abide by the decision of a peer jury of the same age.

An essential component to teen court is that, as part of the sentence, the offender must sit in on one (or preferably more) future peer juries to determine a sentence for other offenders. The results of these courts are astounding.



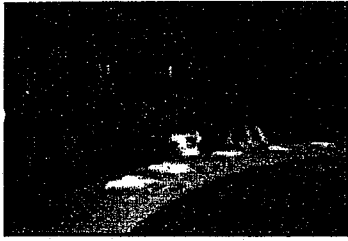

Literally, anyone reading this can become the catalyst to get a court going in your community-- and, no, you don't have to be of voting age to help get one going!

Some guidelines

There are basic guidelines under which a teen / peer court is usually set up... Flexibility, along with local control and simplicity of operation, are the keys to making a court work.

Here are a few basics:

Sanctioning by a local juvenile court judge.

The judge who otherwise would apply sentencing needs to allow for this alternative method of sentencing.

An adult administrator in charge.

Having a person who really likes kids (as opposed to someone who merely acts the part) is important. Kids can tell the difference. Experience with or ability to counsel kids would be very helpful.

A location to hold the proceedings.

An official government site, such as a courtroom or city council chambers often lends additional credibility and the feel of authenticity to the proceedings.

Funding.

The court should not become a bureaucracy. The kids can help keep it running. Not much more than the salary of an administrator is required. The community work that kids perform often gives them job skills and helps produce a net gain in productivity over cost. ...Not to mention savings in the criminal system for future crimes not committed.

This Month's Feature: Jury Duty



1 Jurors check in approximately 20-30 minutes before the first trial begins. In Knox County, Illinois, volunteers have been drawn from local high schools and junior highs. Some jurors may be past defendants.



2 An adult volunteer explains the procedures that will be followed. For example, jurors are reminded of the confidentiality oath.



3 The bailiff escorts jurors into the courtroom. A Real Audio interview explains what one of our bailiffs has learned through his experience with Teen Court.



4 After listening to the prosecutor and the defense attorney, the jury retires to a special room to consider the sentence options. Once the decision has been made, they will return to the courtroom where the sentence will be announced. The sentence will include features such as counseling, community service, a letter of apology, and jury duty. A Real Audio interview explains what one of our jurors has learned through his experience.

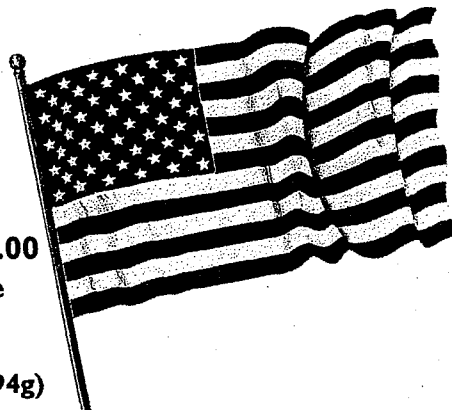
